
Trimlett Twister Tool Quick Start Guide

Quick steps to get twisting with the Trimlett Twister Tool.

1. Attach two (or more) colors of glass together.




2. Make the ends of the stack neat and tidy.




TIP:

Pay close attention to the heat in your glass as well as the heat in the Trimlett Twister Tool. You want the heat even in the glass and you want the tool to be warm as well. The heat in the tool will help prevent the dreaded "dog-bone".

3. Heat the end of the stack and the end of the Trimlett Twister Tool.



4. Touch the Trimlett Twister Tool to the end of the stack. Be sure to center it between the layers of glass so that it catches each color.



Be careful not to bury the Trimlett Twister Tool in the glass...just touch it to the end of the stack.

- **5.** Repeat for the other side.
- 6. TWIST! **

Trimlett Twister Tool set contains:

- 2 stainless steel Twister Tools one for each hand (these act as punties for making the twist)
- One Brass Pusher Tool
 (to help join your ends when you apply the twist to a bead or for any other time you need to push or tuck some hot glass)

Trimlett Twister Tool advantages:

- Rubber covered handles for a non-skid grip.
- Heavy metal holds more heat.
- Works great for off-mandrel work like marbles and buttons!
- It's pretty & functional! The bead at the end is lovely (made by Heather) and works as a counter balance for more comfort.
